Our attendance % half way through the year is a healthy 96.16%. The children know getting over 96% is our target so we hope we can sustain and even improve on that.



Easter Celebration Service



Once again this April our Upper School children will be celebrating Easter through music and poetry at St. Margaret's Church. The service will take place on Thursday 2nd April starting at approximately 1:30 and will last about an hour. All Upper School children, and children in Y2 who are in the choir, will have an early lunch and then walk to the church. Once the service is finished, children whose parents are in attendance will be able to go home with them. The rest of the

children will walk back to school for the end of the school day. We hope we are lucky with the weather, as we have been in previous years and hope you can join us for this service.

The choir, musicians and children who are reciting poetry will go to the church that morning for a rehearsal. As in previous years we are then going to take the opportunity to share our children's talent in the community by taking some of the performers to Stanley Park Care Home to share some of our Easter Celebration with the residents before returning to school for lunch. More information will be given to parents of the children involved nearer the time.

Preschool Places Don't forget you can still apply for a Pre-School place at our school. If you – or any of your friends or family members - have a child who has just turned 3 years old or will do so before the end of August, then you are eligible to apply for a free Pre-School place from September 2020. If you have not submitted an application yet, please request a form from the office and return it as soon as possible as we will be confirming places by the end of May.

Open Morning – We are going to hold an Open Morning for all parents who have expressed an interest in their child starting in our Reception in September. An invitation letter will be sent out shortly. This is particularly important for families who are not currently associated with our school and may not have been to look round. We feel it's important that parents should come to visit to see exactly what we have to offer.

Year 6 Swimming

It is our aim for all children to be able to swim 25 metres by the time they leave primary school. All children get the chance to swim during Y3 and Y4 and until now, they have not had chance to swim again. This year we have booked a slot at the Louisa Centre after May half term to give the Y6 children the opportunity if they can't already swim 25 m, to do so before the time they leave us. All Y6 children will attend the first session to be assessed and then after that a target group will attend every week until the end of term with the aim of reaching the swimming expectations for the end of KS2.

Race for Life

Tanfield School have invited our Y4 and Y5 children to take part in their 'Race for Life' in aid of Cancer Research UK. It's on Thursday 5th March and will be a sponsored event. A letter and sponsor form will be sent home with the children this week.
