Dear Parents and Carers,

It's the end of Week 2 already and all seems to be running smoothly so far. If you follow us on twitter you'll have seen that the children have enjoyed a great variety of learning – scientists, artists, mathematicians, writers, explorers, sports people... you can see this and more if you check out our twitter account @TanfieldPrimary

We are now in a position to confirm some dates for the year. We've decided to plan up to February half term. We'll see how things go and if the situation has changed by then (for the better we hope) then we'll be in a better position to know what will be possible for the second half of the academic year.

We've had to look at our usual, traditional events and decide what we could do and what was potentially too difficult to arrange. It's been our aim to ensure that we do as much as we can for the children to enrich their learning and ensure that they have a breadth of experiences as well as some exciting things to look forward to. I hope we've managed this despite the restrictions we are working within. We are having to work differently but hopefully it will work just as well.

There are some other things I wanted to mention to you are remind you about too.

Beginning and end of the school day

The arrangements are generally working well. Adults are remaining socially distanced, the children are coming to school calm and settled. Just a few reminders:

- → Only one adult per family (even if you have 2 or more children, please just one adult to reduce the number of people on the site)
- → Please keep to your time slot. Each year group, apart from Y5 and Y6, has a 15 minute window to arrive to school and leave. Please do not come on to the grounds before your allocated time.
- → When collecting your child, please don't be late as this can impact on the next group of adults arriving on site.
- \rightarrow Please keep your children with you at all times. They should not be allowed to run around and play on playground equipment.
- \rightarrow Please don't bring any dogs onto the school grounds.

Finally:

→ Please don't wait outside of school. If you can time your arrival for your time slot and on leaving, don't group outside of school – this can cause congestion and impact on the ability for all to maintain their social distance.

We need to work together to keep our school community as safe as possible. Thank you.

Non School Uniform Days

For those parents who are new to us, we have a non-school uniform day on first Friday of the month (except September). We ask for a monetary donation (one per family) to support enrichment activities within school. Although we are now taking most payments through Schoolcomms, for non school uniform days we ask for cash. Thanks in anticipation for your support with this.

This year we have decided to donate the first month's contribution to The People's Kitchen. We have supported them before through our Harvest Celebrations. As we are not doing that this year we thought this would be an alternative way to support them.

Sharing information about your child's progress

Last year we adapted the way we keep you informed of your child's progress and their attitude to learning. This seemed to work well and so we will be continuing it this year. Parents of children in Y1 to Y6 will receive an 'Attitudes to Learning' sheet before half term each term. This will indicate how they are engaging in their learning, their participation in class, behaviour and approach to home learning. All parents will then have the opportunity to talk to the class teacher (the autumn term Parent Meeting will be a phone call appointment) and then, towards the end of the term parents will receive a data sheet indicating where their child is working in relation to age related expectations.

As well as the Parent Meetings, Pre-School and Reception parents will receive a termly update regarding their child's progress. In the autumn term this will be regarding how they have settled in. The spring and summer updates will be regarding current progress including an update for Reception as to where their child is in relation to age related expectations. Parents will be asked to add their own comments too regarding progress at home. This will all be explained by the staff when these are issued.

This information sharing is important so you know how your child is progressing and you can offer support and encouragement.

Friday's Recognition Assembly

Traditionally every Friday afternoon we hold an assembly for Y1 to Y6 to recognise the children's achievements and celebrate all that has happened during the week in school. We also review class attendance for the week as we have a half termly competition for the best attending class. We discuss the overall % attendance for each class and then also enter all children (Reception through to Y6) who have 100% attendance for the week into a prize draw. The children's names are put into a spinner and a name is randomly selected. They get a small packet of sweets or small fun item. This year the assembly will take place in the children's classrooms.



Success Cards are also awarded during this assembly. A Success Card is awarded when your child receives 10 'stamps' in their Personal Organiser. The stamps are awarded for something a bit special – usually in recognition of particular consistency, resilience, growth mindset, progress, behaviour, commitment, being a good citizen. These are recorded in the Personal Organiser with a brief note saying why they have got it. Once a child has 10 'stamps' then they will receive a Success Card. This will be presented to them in the Recognition Assembly.

The Success Cards are progressive from Pre-School right through to Y6 and take a trip round the world. Each one represents a different country. The first to be awarded will be the United Kingdom followed by European countries and then beyond. There will be a total of 12 to achieve during their time in school.

When a child is awarded a Success Card, in addition to the certificate being awarded in assembly, a postcard will be sent out to parents telling you to watch out for the certificate and share in your child's success.

The postcards will match up with the country awarded i.e. for the United Kingdom Certificate you will receive a postcard with the British flag on and some information about United Kingdom that you can share with your child. The postcard will be sent instead of children receiving the small gifts we have previously given.

Being awarded a Success Card is a significant achievement and will take some time to be gained. Please keep an eye in your child's Personal Organiser so you can see the 'stamps' they receive during the year and what they get them for. The 'stamps' will be carried over each year so, for example, if a child has accumulated 6 'stamps' in Y1 then they will start Y2 with that number, needing only 4 more to achieve a Success Card.
