

Dear Parents, 24th November 2020

First of all, thank you for adapting to the tighter times for the start of the school day as per the 5th November newsletter. This has ensured that the classes can all have a prompt start to the day and it helps in keeping the bubbles separate.

As you will know, we had to close one of our bubbles last week. The children concerned will return to school on 1st December. The measures we have in place will hopefully have been effective in limiting the transmission of the virus within the bubble. The great benefit of having the bubbles means that we only had to send home one group of children. By continuing to keep children separate means it reduces how many are affected.

It is crucial at the start and end of the day that parents ensure they keep their children with them when waiting on the yard for siblings. I have had to speak to children almost daily about running around the yards, playing on equipment and mixing with other year groups. We work very hard to keep them all separate during the day. Please help us with this at the end of the day by ensuring your child remains with you at all times. Thank you.

Staffing Changes

Miss Ellis's class were informed recently that she will be leaving us at the end of this term. She is relocating to Wales and has secured a job in a school near Chester. We will be very sorry to see her go. Miss Ellis started her teaching career with us five years ago and has taught in Y5 and Y4. As well as being an excellent classroom practitioner she has also significantly developed our Science curriculum, ensuring it is exciting and interactive. I know you will join me in wishing her all the best. Miss Forsyth will replace Miss Ellis up until the end of this academic year. She is relocating from Scotland. She attended our staff training last week and has met the children this week. We look forward to welcoming her to our team.

In addition to this, Mrs Townsend has decided to retire at the end of this term. Mrs Townsend has worked within our school community for over 20 years. First as clerical support at the Infant School and then as part of the primary school team where her role has evolved over the years. She now manages the Breakfast Club in addition to all of the clerical work she carries out. She will also be a great miss. We are very appreciative of all she has done to support our school community over many years and wish her all the best in her retirement.

Update on your child's attainment - Reception through to Y6

Last year, following feedback from the parent questionnaire, we introduced the 'Attitudes to Learning' sheets prior to Parent Meetings and then, following our mid-term assessments, we sent out information updating parents on their child's attainment. These data sheets will be sent out this Friday. They will be put in your child's organiser (Reception parents will get these emailed directly to them). Please watch out for them.

School Meals - Lunch Hound

For many years the children have said that they would like to be able to choose their meals in advance so that they get their preferred choice. Until now this has not been possible, but we were recently asked to take part in a trial of Lunch Hound which would enable this to happen. The School Council have been involved in meetings with Taylor Shaw, our caterers, and the system has been implemented. The children may have mentioned this to you. Inevitably there have been some initial teething problems but the system now seems to be working well and can only be beneficial for the children.

Teacher Training Days

On Thursday, the staff received training from Steve Ingle about sticky learning (supporting the children to remember more). We aim to find further interesting ways to support children in retaining the information they learn about. As parents you can help with this by regularly practising spellings and supporting your child to access Times Table Rockstars (Years 2 - 6) and Mathletics (Rec - Year 6).

Extended School Day

The two sessions we have had so far have gone well. Can I thank you again for your support with this. What we have put in place will benefit everyone. These sessions will continue every Wednesday until July.
