We are now rapidly approaching the end of our first half term so it's timely to send you a few updates and reminders.



I've recently written to you about our Parent Governor Vacancy. If you are interested in applying for this and haven't done so yet, please submit your application by the end of today, Wednesday 20th October.

Catch Up Plans (Extended day on a Wednesday)

I said that we would review this provision before half term. As far as we are aware, no more funding will be made available for this particular 'Catch Up' provision.

We have therefore decided to continue this for the next half term, up to and including Wednesday 8th December.

After this, Catch Up in this format will end and the school day on a Wednesday will finish at the same time as the other days of the school week, starting from Wednesday 15th December.

Thank you very much for your support with this. It has made a difference to all children regarding the Maths support we have put in place as well as giving us the opportunity to do some focused English support with many individual children. We could not have done this without your support.



Eligibility for Free School Meals

We are aware that people's financial situation can change very quickly in the current climate. If you find that your family are now accessing benefits then your child/ren may be eligible to access free school meals. As well as helping you financially, it also helps the school. If you think that you may be eligible,

please contact the office and they will give you a simple form to complete. These forms can be processed very quickly so you don't have to wait too long to find out.

Parent Meetings

Parents of children in Reception through to Y6 will have received an email last week informing you that booking is now open for Parent Meetings (via a video link) on Monday and Tuesday the 1st and 2nd November. If you have not booked an appointment yet please do so as soon as possible to avoid disappointment. Attitudes to Learning and Pre-School and Reception Autumn Updates

These forms, giving you an update on how your child has approached their learning this term, will be sent out today (Wednesday), with your child. Please watch out for them.

Websites supporting Home Learning

Don't forget, the children access a number of different websites to support their learning. Just ask them about it and I am sure they will enjoy showing you. If they have forgotten their login details then you'll find the details in their Personal Organiser. This is a way we can support the children's learning without having to sit with them throughout the activity. The websites include: Times Tables Rockstars, Numbots, Mathletics, Bug Club, Nessy and Readiwriter.

Nasal Flu Vaccine

This will take place in school on Friday 26th November and will be offered to all children from Reception through to Y6. The vaccine is given as a spray squirted up each nostril. It's quick and painless.

The vaccine will still work even if your child gets a runny nose, sneezes or blows their nose.

The nasal spray flu vaccine gives children the best protection against flu. It may take around 2 weeks for the flu vaccine to work.

Any children who catch flu after vaccination are less likely to be seriously ill or be admitted to hospital.

We'll receive more information nearer the time and will then seek permission from you for this.

If you have a child who will turn 3 before August 2022 then they will be eligible to start our Pre-School in September 2022. You must apply for a place and these forms can be obtained from the office.

School Dinners


