Tanfield Partnership have bought all children in school a commemorative pen, celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Unfortunately, they arrived in school on the day the death of the Queen was announced. We appreciate the Tanfield Partnership's thought and kindness with this gesture and will be giving the pens out this week to the children.

## Home Learning

As you know, Home Learning is given to the children on a Wednesday, and we ask that it is returned by the following Monday.

Home Learning is key to helping children consolidate their learning and in making it stick. Remembering what you have learnt is so important and this comes through going over things. Due to Covid, over the last two years we have given Home Learning in two forms — through their Home Learning book and assigned via eSchools.

We introduced eSchools as it was a way of sharing home learning virtually which became essential when children were off isolating with Covid. Moving forward, we have recognised that we no longer need what eSchools can offer. Children are now only off if they are ill (not isolating) and so it is not necessary to be able to offer work via this method. From now on all Home Learning will be completed in their Home Learning books or through specified websites. We will not be using eSchools to assign homework or use it to communicate with parents. If you do need to contact your child's teacher about something, then either ring school or email them on the school email address tanfieldlea@durhamlearning.net

## Entering and Leaving the school grounds

We are operating a one-way system on the school yard when you enter and leave at the start and end of the day.

It would be very helpful if people would keep to this as it eases congestion. To support this, could parents not congregate at the top of the steps leading from the Upper School. This is reducing the space others have to exit and is causing a blockage. If you are waiting for your child, please wait on the main yard – not at the top of the steps. If you have been meeting your Y5 or Y6 child at the top of the steps rather than outside of the school grounds, please feel free to come and wait for them on the yard.

### **New Spelling Scheme**

In September 2022, we launched a new spelling scheme from Year 1 to 6, where initially all children in the class learn the same list of words. This reduces the time taken to do the spelling tests, allowing the teachers to spend more time focusing on the spelling patterns. Thank you for your support in helping your child to learn their spellings. If your child is finding the spellings difficult to learn, your child's teacher will discuss this with you at parents evening to see if this spelling list might be adapted in some way (a shorter list of words or a different set of words).

#### Leave of Absence in term time

Time in school is valuable and it is important children miss as little school as possible. We have regular school holidays as well as the teacher training days that families can use to go away as a family.

Schools can only authorise absence in exceptional circumstances and this is very rare. Holiday requests in term time will not be authorised and if they are over 6 days then fines will be issued.

Please refer to the 'Dates for your Diary' to see when our school holidays are and book to go away during these times. Thank you.

## Parking outside of school

If you have to arrive at school by car, whether it is for Breakfast Club or the start of the school day, can you please respect the safety measures in place outside of school. Unless you have a Blue Badge and are walking your child in to school you should not be parking or stopping on the double yellow or zig-zag lines. Neither should you be pulling up on the kerb or turning in the road or the school entrances. We must ensure the safety of the children at all times and drivers who are not adhering to the Highway Code are putting our children in danger. Please make sure you park and manoeuvre sensibly. Thank you.
