We are now in the lead up to Christmas and there are a lot of things for the children and yourselves to look forward to in the next few weeks.

This letter is to explain the activities you might like to join us for. You'll have already seen them on previous newsletters.

For the Early Years and Key Stage 1 performances we are requesting that you attend only one of the performances (there are two on offer) and that only 2 adults attend this.

Early Years Christmas Performance (Reception and Pre-School)

These will take place on Wednesday 7th December Either: 9:15 or 2:15

Key Stage 1 Nativity (Year 1 and 2)

These will take place on Thursday 8th December Either: 9:15 or 2:00



We are not going to do tickets for the performances but will expect only 2 adults for each child at one performance. This way we can ensure there is enough room in the hall for everyone.

We then have the Key Stage 2 Carol Service on the last day of term – 20th December (Y3 to Y6)

All children in Key Stage 2 will be taking part in this and this year we'd like to invite their parents to join us. I know many of you who have had the opportunity to attend this in the past have thoroughly enjoyed it and have missed it when we've not been able to invite you.

The arrangements will be as follows:

All Key Stage 2 children to meet at St. Margaret's Church in Tanfield Village – parents to bring them there instead of school that morning, arriving between 8:40 and 8:50 and bringing the children to the hall which is near the church on the opposite side of the road.

Parents then take their seat in church ready for the service to begin. The service will start as soon as we are ready probably between 9:15 and 9:30.

Parents who are attending can bring younger siblings as once the service is over, the children who have attended the church service will be able to go home.


Those children who do not have an adult there will come back to school for the rest of the day.
