Non-Christmas News first:

School Data

The school is required to publish its school data on an annual basis. Due to Covid we have not had any data since 2019 but in May our children completed the statutory Teacher Assessments. We were very pleased with our assessments across the school. Although the pandemic clearly had an impact on the children's learning our school results compared extremely favourably with other schools nationally. All data is now uploaded to our website. You'll find it in the 'Key Information' section under 'Results and Performance Data'.

Calculation Policy

Over the last year the staff, led by our Maths Subject Leaders, have been working on a Calculation Policy. The purpose of this is to ensure consistency in the teaching and learning of the four operations from the time children start school in Pre-School through to Y6. As the children move through school they will develop their written methods from practical to pictorial representation before moving to more formal written methods that will prepare them for their adult lives. Our Calculation Policy aims to show the progressive steps the children will take, the vocabulary they will use, the resources that will support their learning and how their work will be presented in their books. We recognise that this will be very helpful for you, as parents, as you support your child/ren with their home learning. This has now been finalised and can be found on our website under Curriculum/Maths/Calculation Progression. We hope you can find time to look at this as we do think you'll find it very useful.

Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE)

PSHE is a necessary and important part of children's education. We have a well-planned and fully embedded PSHE curriculum which covers all aspects of the curriculum including relationships education. This includes the children learning about themselves and their body. When they learn about their body we will refer to parts of their body using the correct terminology. It's important that children learn the correct biological/medical names in order to have the right language to describe the private parts of their body accurately and support their understanding of the human body.

Bank Holiday - Monday 8th May 2023 and Key Stage 2 SATS

An additional bank holiday in honour of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III will take place on Monday 8th May 2023. This means that the school will be closed on 8th May.

As this date had previously been announced as the first day of the 2023 Key Stage 2 test week a change to the KS2 test schedule next year has been made.

It has been decided that KS2 tests will take place one day later than originally planned. As such, the new schedule will be:

- Tuesday 9th May: English grammar, punctuation and spelling papers 1 and 2
- Wednesday 10th May: English reading paper
- Thursday 11th May: Maths papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)
- Friday 12th May: Maths paper 3 (reasoning)

It's really important that all children in Y6 are in school this week, as well as the weeks preceding this.

Christmas News next:

Here's a guick reminder from our Christmas Performance newsletter last week:

For the Early Years and Key Stage 1 performances we are requesting that you attend only one of the performances (there are two on offer) and that only 2 adults attend this.

Early Years Christmas Performance (Reception and Pre-School)

These will take place on **Wednesday 7th December** Either: 9:15 or 2:15

Key Stage 1 Nativity (Year 1 and 2)

These will take place on **Thursday 8th December Either:** 9:15 **or** 2:00



We are not going to do tickets for the performances but will expect *only* 2 adults for each child at *one* performance. This way we can ensure there is enough room in the hall for everyone.

Key Stage 2 Carol Service on the last day of term – 20th December (Y3 to Y6) All children in Key Stage 2 will be taking part in this and this year we'd like to invite their parents to join us. I know many of you who have had the opportunity to attend this in the past have thoroughly enjoyed it and have missed it when we've not been able to invite you.



The arrangements will be as follows:

All Key Stage 2 children to meet at St. Margaret's Church in Tanfield Village – parents to bring them there instead of school that morning, arriving between 8:40 and 8:50 and bringing the children to the hall which is near the church on the opposite side of the road. (For those parents who cannot take their children to the church we will be sending out another letter regarding arrangements for them soon.)

Parents then take their seat in church ready for the service to begin. The service will start as soon as we are ready – probably between 9:15 and 9:30.

Parents who are attending can bring younger siblings as once the service is over, the children who have attended the church service will be able to go home.

Those children who do not have an adult there will come back to school for the rest of the day.

Any younger siblings who do not attend the Carol Service, and so have come to school as usual, will not be allowed to be picked up early from school after the service.

Christmas Dinner and Christmas Jumper Day is on Wednesday 7th December. Orders have already been taken for those staying for dinner, but we encourage all children to come in something Christmassy that day, instead of their uniform, to add to the occasion [®]

Christmas Fair

Our Christmas Fair is on Monday 19th December, after school from 3:30 until no later than 4:30. We hope you can join us for this. The children will be planning their class stalls over the next three weeks in preparation for this.


School Choir
