World War 1 and 2 by Logan H.

The First World War saw the Entente Powers, led by France, Russia, the British Empire, and later Italy (from 1915) and the United States (from 1917), defeat the Central Powers, led by the German, Austro-Hungarian, Bulgarian and Ottoman Empires. Russia withdrew from the war after the revolution in 1917.

The assassination of Austrian Archduke Franz Ferdinand on 28 June 1914 set off a chain of events that led to war in early August 1914. The assassination was traced to a Serbian extremist group that wanted to increase Serbian power in the Balkans by breaking up the Austro-Hungarian Empire. 1 story in WW1 states. 'On December 25th sometime between 1914 and 1918 British soldiers and Germans soldiers came to a standstill.' In this standstill, they both stopped fighting. They truced. In the truce, they both played football and celebrated Christmas.



In 1933, Adolf Hitler's NAZI party was rising greatly.

Neville Chamberlain made a truce with Germany so they don't start war with Poland. Adolf Hitler's invasion of Poland in September 1939 drove Great Britain and France to declare war on Germany, marking the beginning of World War II. It split the world's nations into two opposing military alliances. The Allies - led by Britain and her Empire, the United States, the Soviet Union and France - united against the Axis Powers of Nazi Germany, Fascist Italy and Imperial Japan. The most deaths of an army was The Soviet Union. In WW2, NAZI Germany were most scared of US artillery barrages. As an island nation, Britain just did not have the manpower to be able to fight across so many global fronts. The Indian army provided a huge 2.5 million soldiers across the world. They were fighting in Burma, in North Africa and in Italy. Italy Invade Egypt in WW2. In 1941, NAZIS did the blitz on London. After Japan nuked Pearl Harbour US dropped 2 atomic bombs on Japan.



Natural Disasters by Iyla and Issey

Hurricanes:

The winds of a hurricane can reach up to 320kmph (around 200mph) . The hurricane starts by the sea surface it generally needs to be at least 27C to provide enough energy, and the winds need to not vary much with height. The hurricane is made of warm ocean water and light winds

Tornados:

Tornadoes are vertical funnels of rapidly spinning air. Their winds may top 250 miles an hour and can clear a pathway a mile wide and 50 miles long. Also known as twisters, tornadoes are born in thunderstorms and are often accompanied by hail. Most last less than ten minutes and travel five to ten kilometres before disappearing. In extreme cases, however, they can last several hours and cross distances over 150km!

Earthquakes:

Earthquakes can occur near the surface or deep below the surface. Earthquakes occur in the crust or upper mantle, from the earth's surface to about 500 miles below the surface. But the very deepest earthquakes only occur at subduction zones where cold crust rock is being pushed deep into the earthquakes
