100% for the class % - 4 points


100% award for one class member each week, names are selected in the random name spinner. Children receive a small prize.

## Uniform

- We encourage independence so please practise fastening coats and buttons before September.
- \* Every child will need a pair of wellies clearly labelled with their name to be able to take part in OPAL activities every lunchtime.















#### OPAL- Outdoor and Adventurous play

Children spend 20% of their time at school playing. With this mind, at Tanfield Lea Community Primary School, we believe that play is a fundamental part of childhood, enriching children's learning, development, and well-being. That's why we are proud to be an OPAL school!

During lunchtime children can access many different areas across the school grounds including: -Digging areas, water play zones, planting areas, cosy cottage, sports zones, dress up, music areas, monkey bars, slides, swings, log play, sand pit, bikes and scooters as well as having cess to many loose parts to play creatively or build dens.

#### P.E.

# Spellings



- Spellings are part of Home Learning and are set on Tuesday and tested on the following Monday.
- We now focus on a whole class set of spelling rules.
- Spellings will be placed in organisers and we expect children to practise using relevant pages.
- Spelling lists for each week can also be found in the organiser.

# Home Learning



- Home learning will be set each Wednesday and needs to be completed and handed in the following Monday.
- Much of this will be supporting basic skills in English and Maths. This could be sentence construction, phonics support or addition and subtraction or an online activity, such as Mathletics.
- We really value any support that you can give to your child at home to further their learning and any comments will help us identify where help is required.



# Routes to Reading



All children will access shared reading books and participations in a daily shared reading session.

This book will be read together in school over 2 weeks and children will become familiar with key vocabulary and the text. It will also consolidate the GPCS/spelling learnt.

At the end of the 2 weeks this book will be sent home to be read with an adult.

Reading books are expected to brought in to school everyday so that adults can listen to children read.



# Dialogical Reading.



Children are familiar with Dialogical Reading from their time in Pre-School and Reception.

They will spend a number of sessions looking at each book and discussing the main features of it.

The overall aim is for the children to develop a love of reading and be able to read these books in their own words.

By the end of Key Stage 1 children will be familiar with over 100 books.

# Writing in Year 2




- In Year 2 we put a lot of emphasis on independent writing and beginning to use their own ideas.
- We expect the children to listen carefully to the sounds in each word and have a good go at recording them in sentences that make sense.
- We ask children in Y2 to begin to extend sentences and use adjectives and adverbs.

# Talk For Writing


- Talk for Writing helps the children remember what they are writing about.
