# Literacy: Word reading (phonics approach)

- Phonics is a method of learning to read
- Works by breaking each word up into individual sounds then blending them back together to make the word
- Children learn to 'decode' rather than memorise 1,000's of words

- Sounds taught from most to least frequently used
- Progressive throughout Reception and Year 1

<b>Word Reading</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs.</li><li>• Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending.</li><li>• Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, including some common exception words.</li></ul>
